Your Faith in Jesus is not in Vain!

I Corinthians 15: ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.

.²⁰But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man.

These verses in the Bible are three of the most important ever written. In fact, these verses are the bedrock, the foundation, the total focus of the Bible. Christianity rises and falls on the truth that Jesus is the only Savior in the universe and that he died and rose again bodily from the grave never to die again. If you remove this truth, then Christianity does not exist!

Be fully reassured that your faith in Jesus is not in vain! Jesus is who he claimed to be: God among us, the messiah, the beginning and the end. Beyond Jesus there is nothing more! His sacrifice on the cross has cleansed you and me who believe in him for eternity.

The day will come when we will all stand before Jesus and give account. Many will claim their goodness, keeping the commandments, helping the poor, loving one another, but that will not get them into the Kingdom of God. When you and I stand before Jesus and he asks why he should let us in we have but one Biblical answer: "Nothing to the cross I bring, only to Christ I cling!"

It is Jesus and his shed blood alone for you and me that opens the door to eternity.

This is why Jesus said:

"I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." John 14:6.

"Enter by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by it. Because narrow is the gate and difficult is the way which leads to life, and there are few who find it." <u>Matthew</u> 7:13-14.

When you surrender your heart, mind, soul and strength to Jesus and him alone you have entered by the narrow gate. As we celebrate Lent and Easter we must affirm over and over this truth. Rejoice brothers and sister because your faith in Jesus is not in vain!


